CREATING A WALDORF INSPIRED GROUP

*First check your area for existing groups (See if there are any waldorf schools or morning gardens around and check with them)

* Ask your friends, check at holistic moms network, la leche league, or local organic food market.

*Check with your local library, where homeschoolers will definitely be.

* Search local homeschool co-op's. There may be waldorf-inspired families there waiting for you.

Once you find one or more you have a “group.”

* Devise a meeting schedule whether it is once a week or once a month.

*Decide on what your objective is. Is this just a playgroup? Will you do circle time together? Tell a story or bake bread? Paint or craft?

*You can use this as a way to have a Waldorf friend. Compare ideas and inspiration. Help and support each other if you can.

*You can do festivals together, create a handwork group or even host a book study.

By creating this support you give yourself the opportunity to ENJOY homeschooling and feel like you are part of a group, not alone.
